# A Fatal 'Error of Judgment'

1986 began quietly, and Americans expected to see it end as the most successful year ever for the National Space Agency.

Tragically however, in the early part of the year, the Space Shuttle Challenger and its crew of seven was blown-up, just a minute and twelve seconds into flight. Among the crew was the first school teacher in space, Kristyn McAuliffe, and the NASA crew included several leading technocrats and a concert pianist.

President Reagan appointed a special committee to look into just why the accident happened as it did, and NASA put off its plans for a few more months. In the midst of these developments, the Space Administration returned to the direction of some of its former, and more successful leadership.

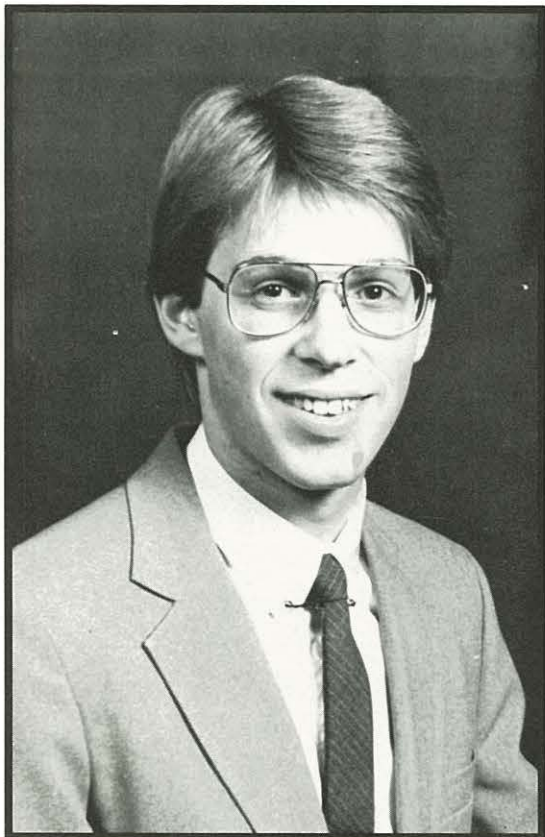
The process of deciding who is who is a rather complex one. The ASNNC Senate nominated 25 seniors and the Academic Council nominated another 25.

These events and the individual of the Junior class highlighted the 1985-'86 school year. A year of development in the lives of the members of the Junior Class.

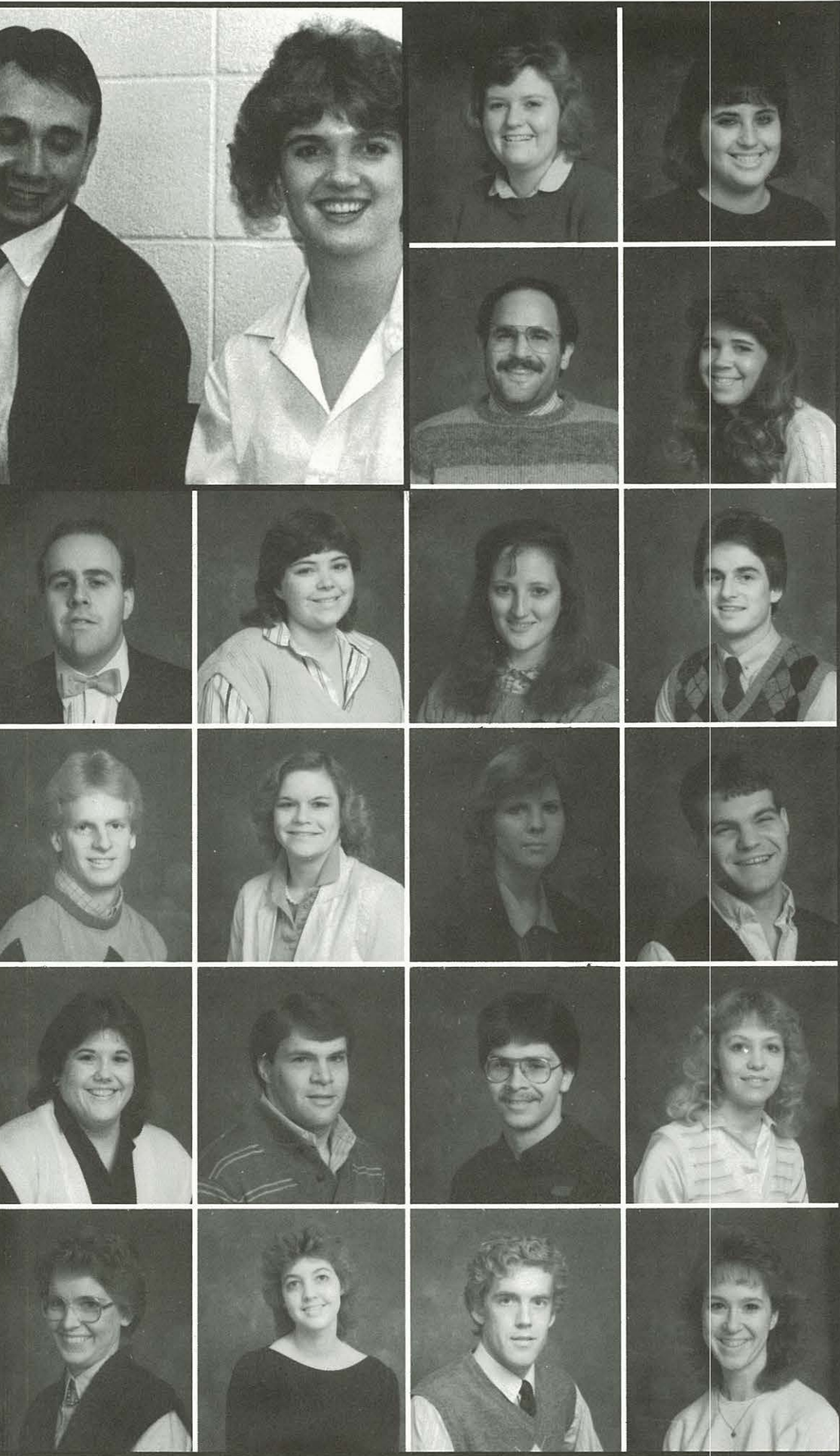

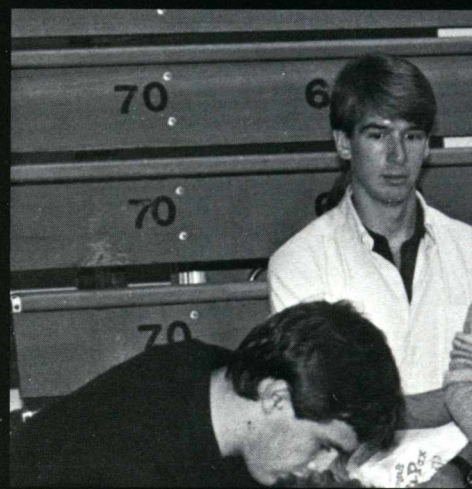


## REGISTRATION

The nicest thing about a not-so-nice day like registration is the sense of reunion. Reunion with those left behind for the long hot summer.

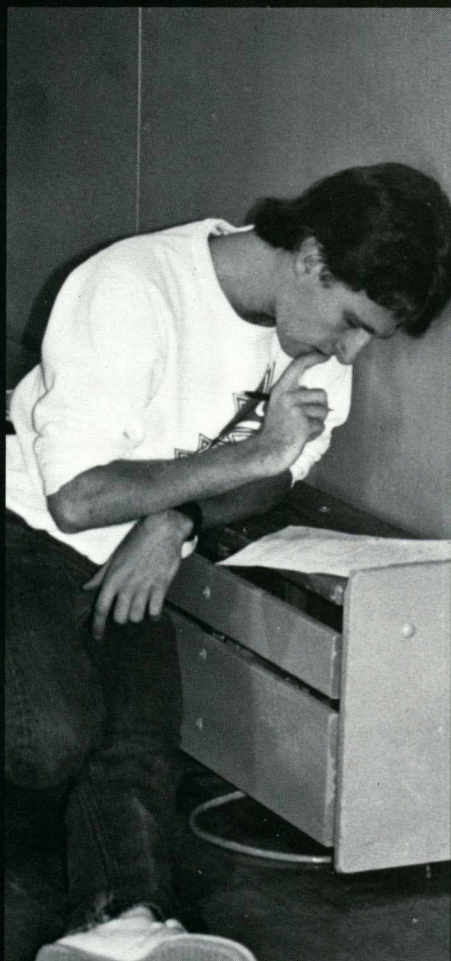

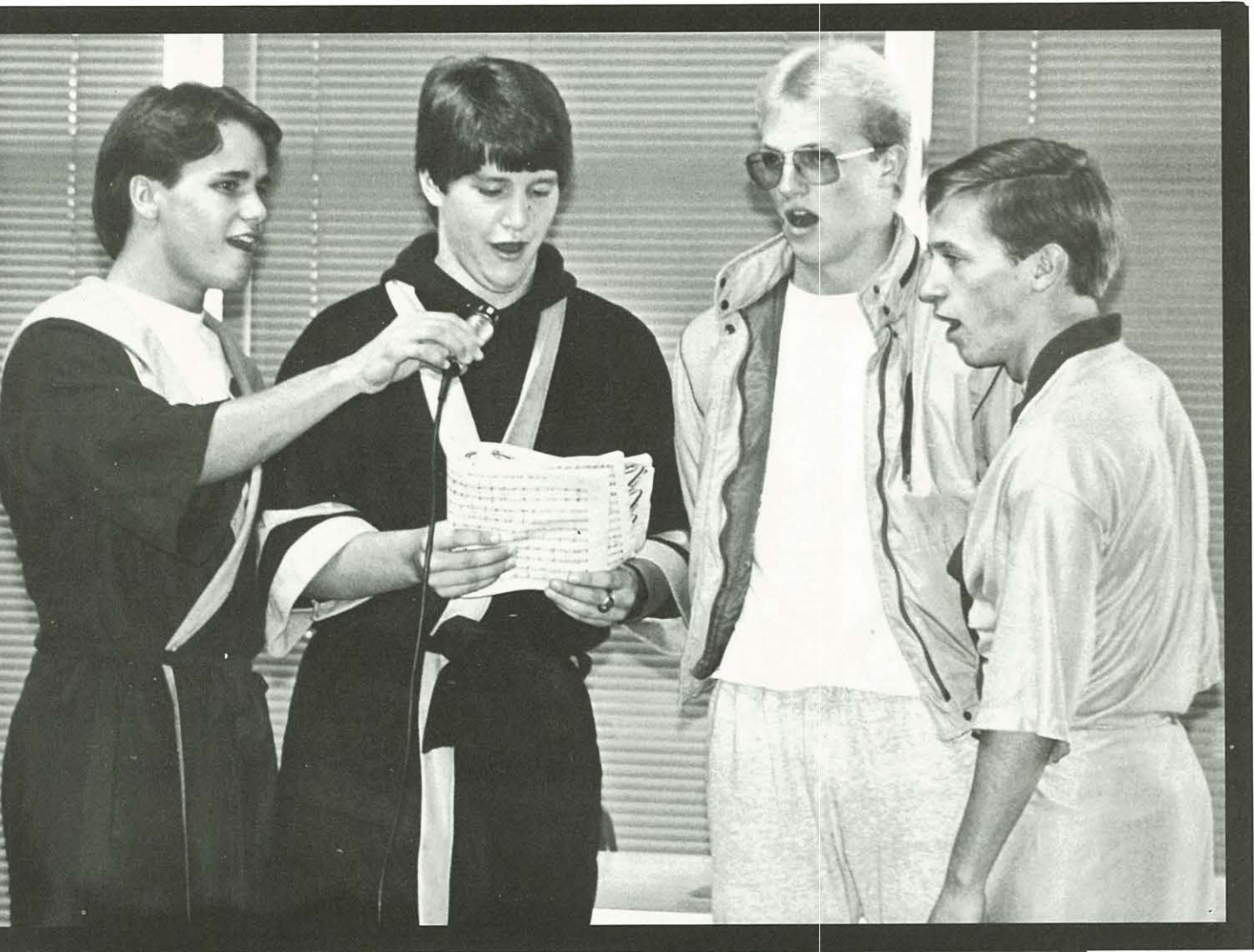
Many recall memories of crawling on the floor in SAGA, their backs loaded with the trays and empty glasses of others. But why?

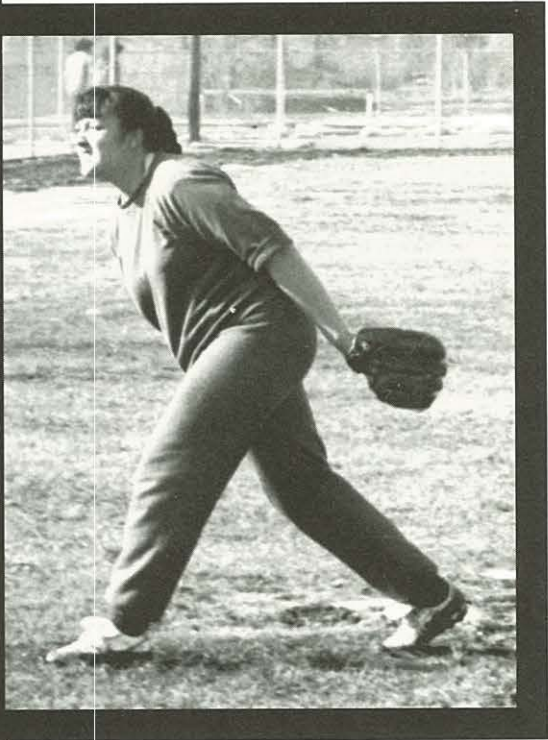
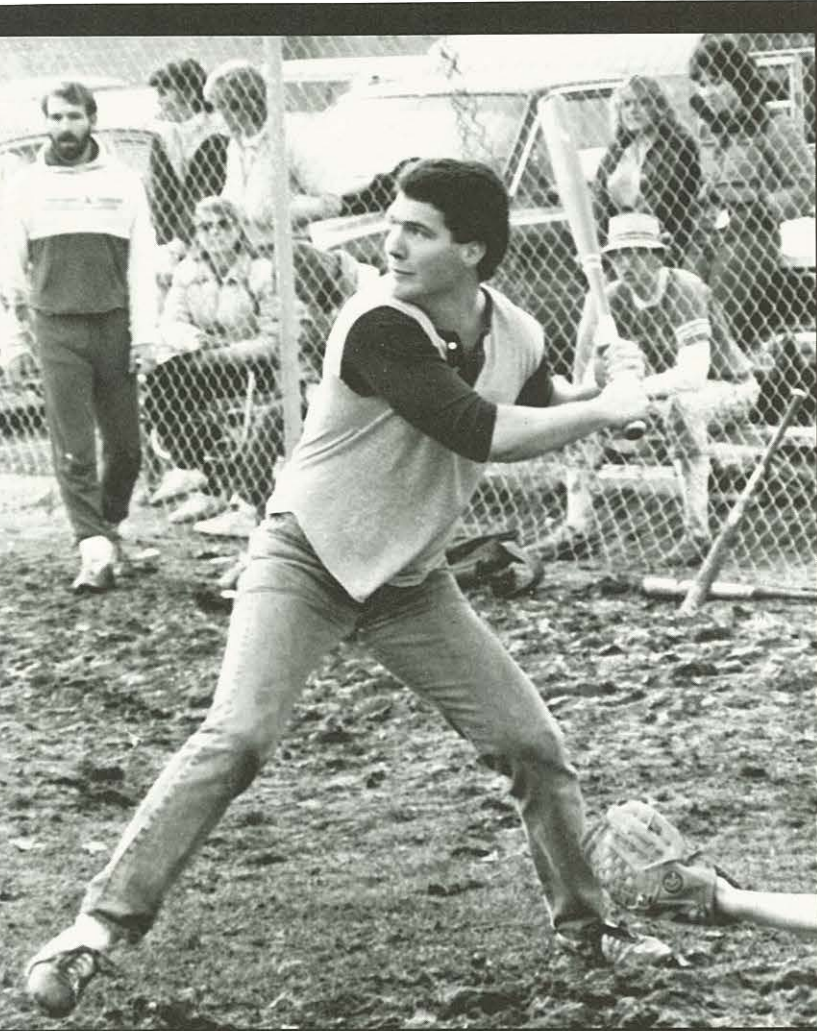


## WINTERFEST

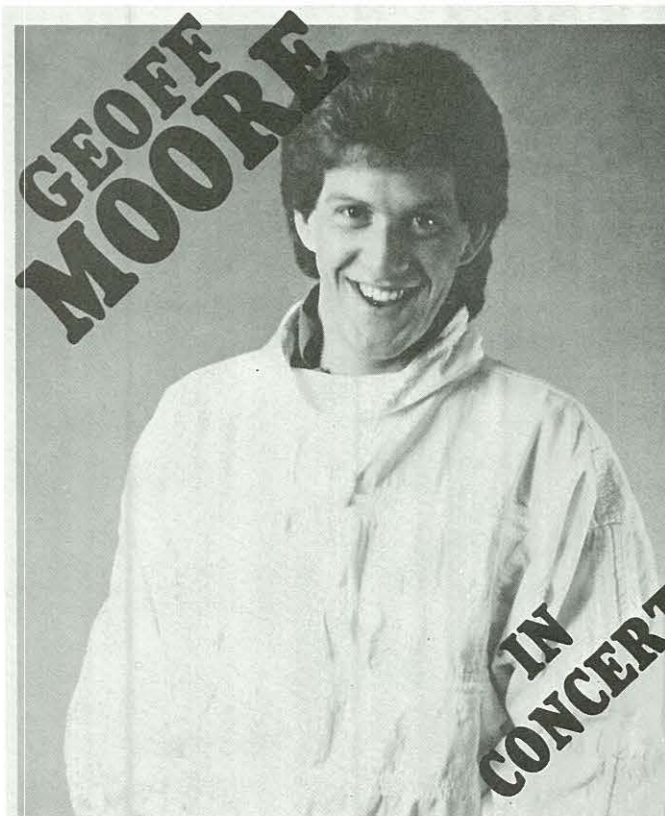
## CONCERTS

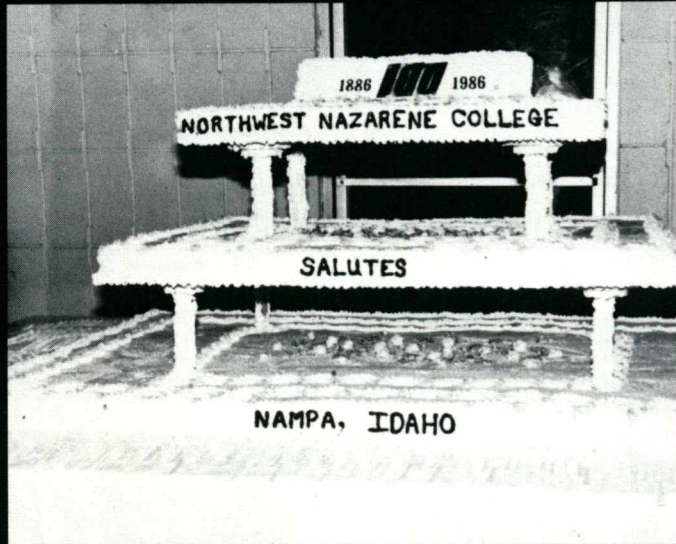




# NAMPA CENTENNIAL

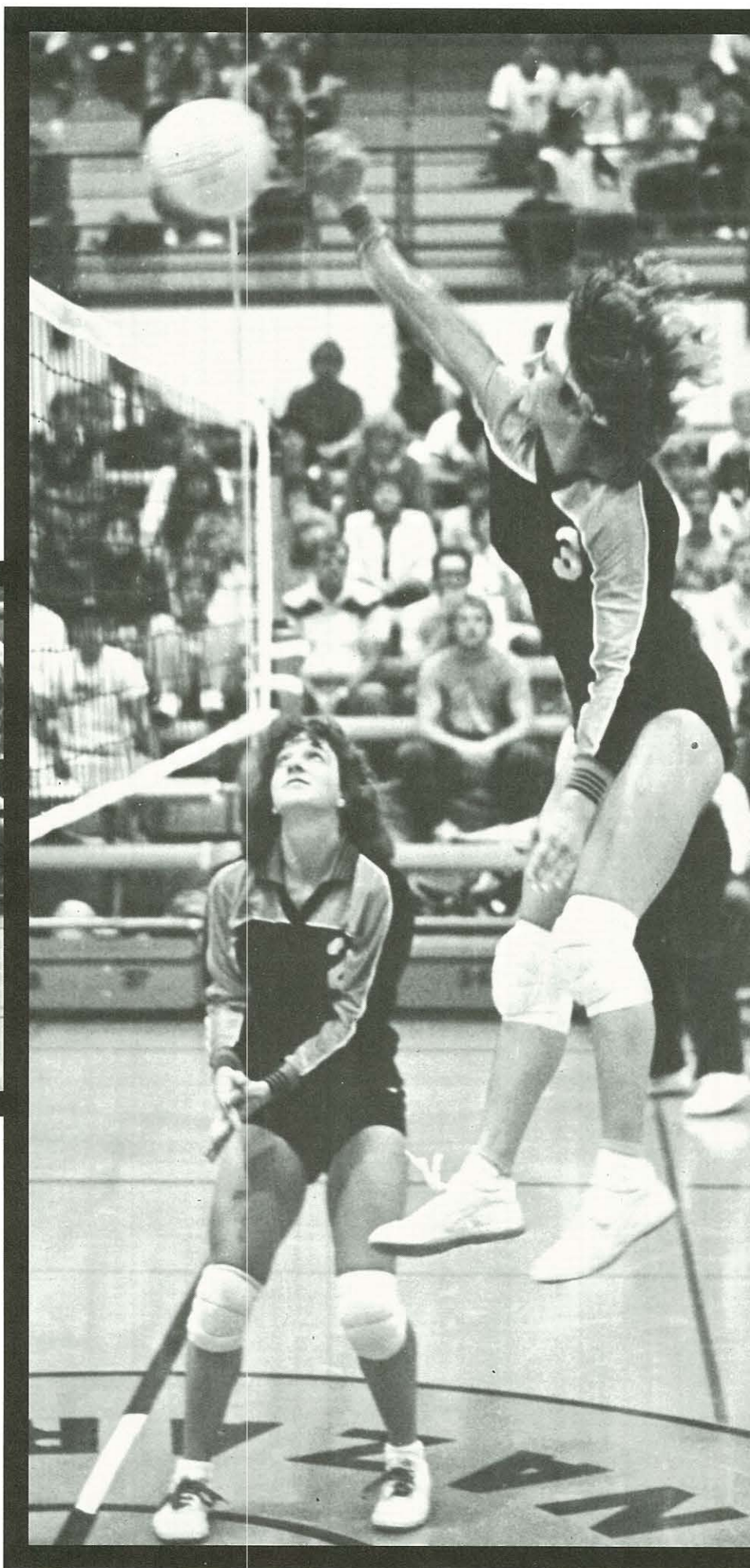
# VOLLEYBALL

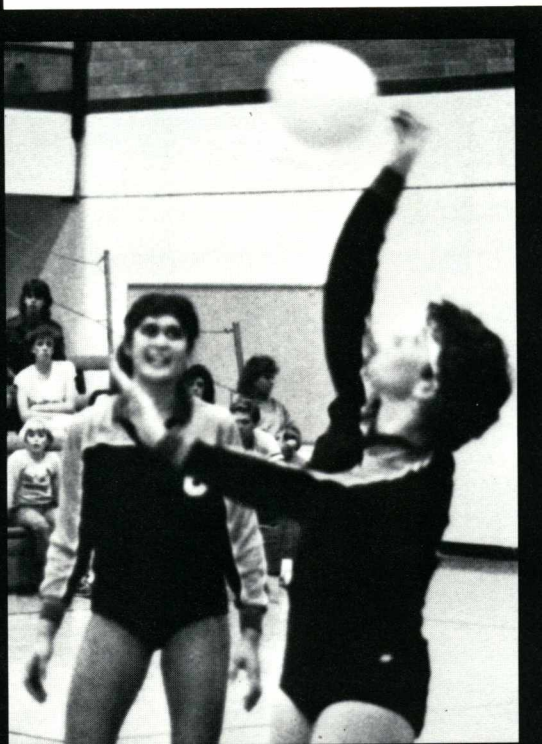

Perhaps the highlight of the season was the suspense filled match with college of Idaho. NNC tied the match in the last few minutes.

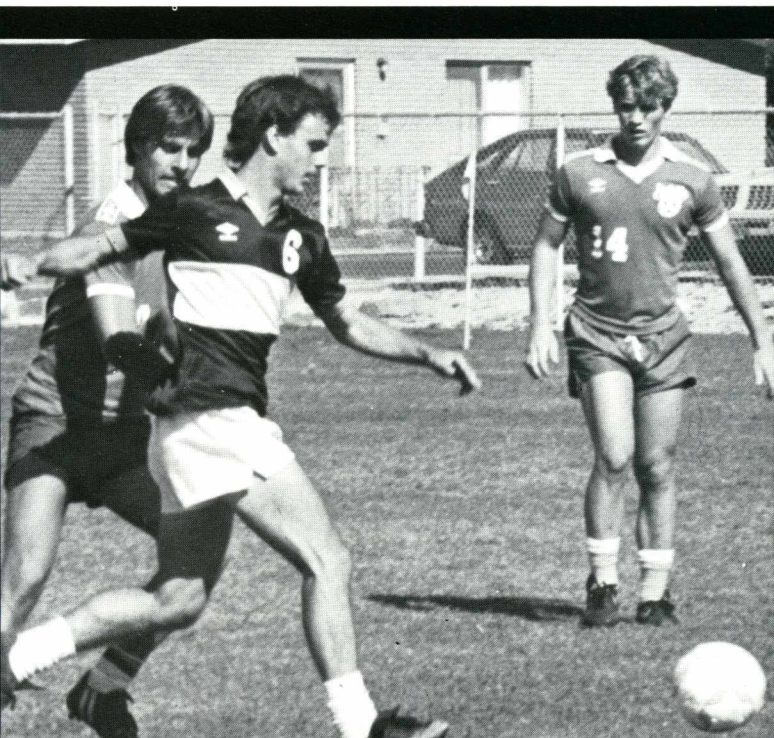

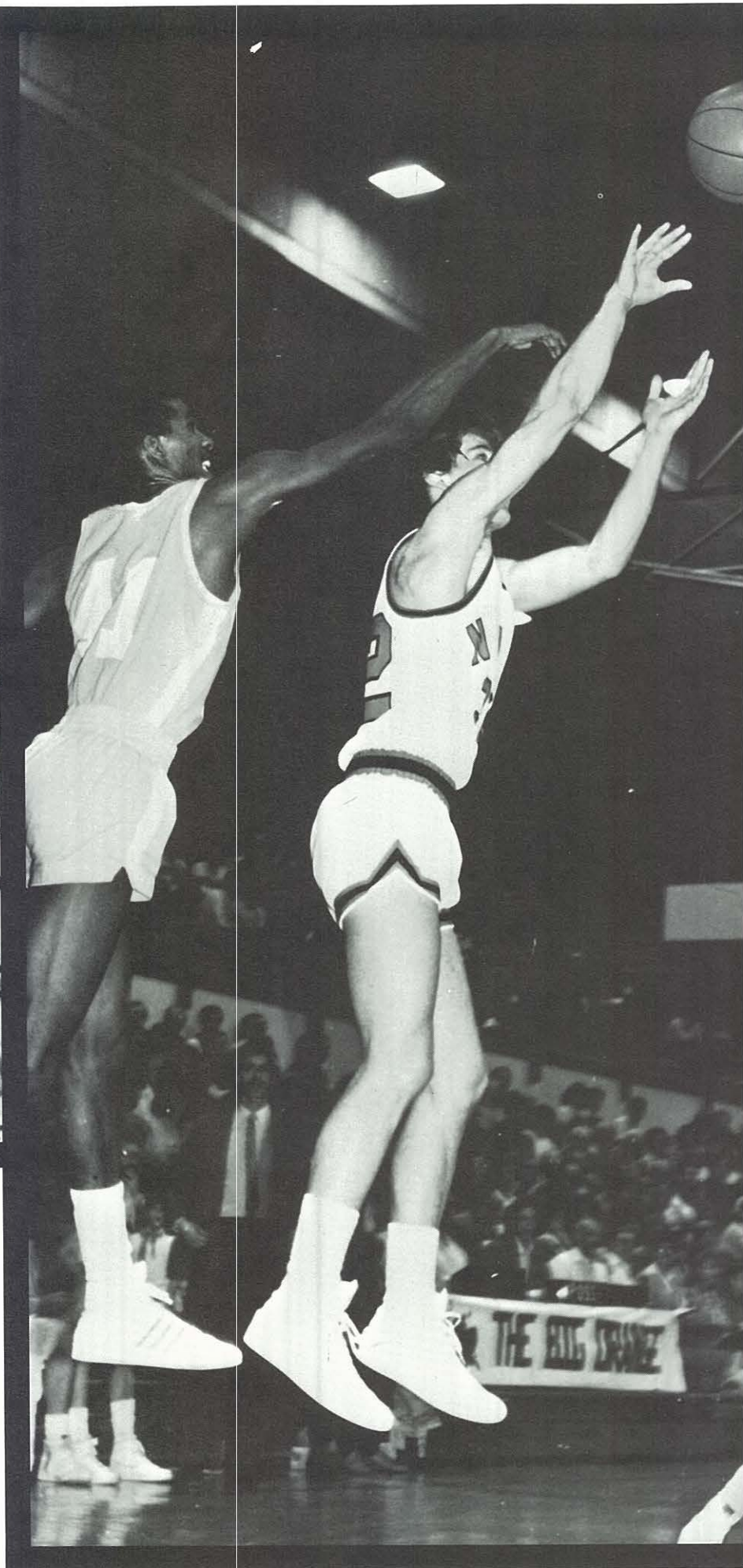
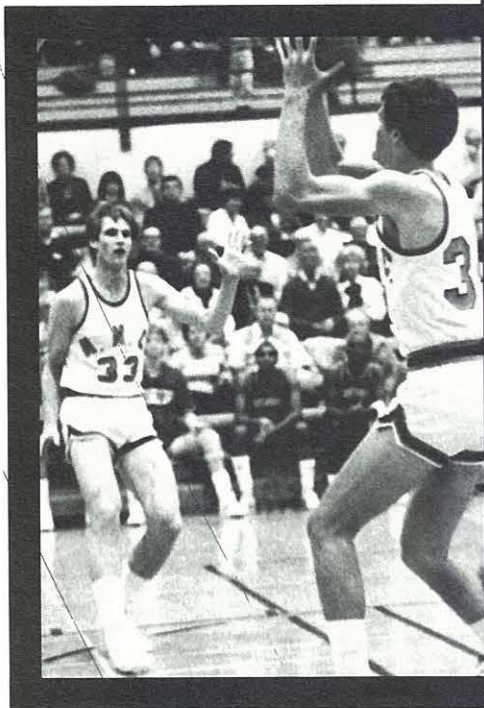




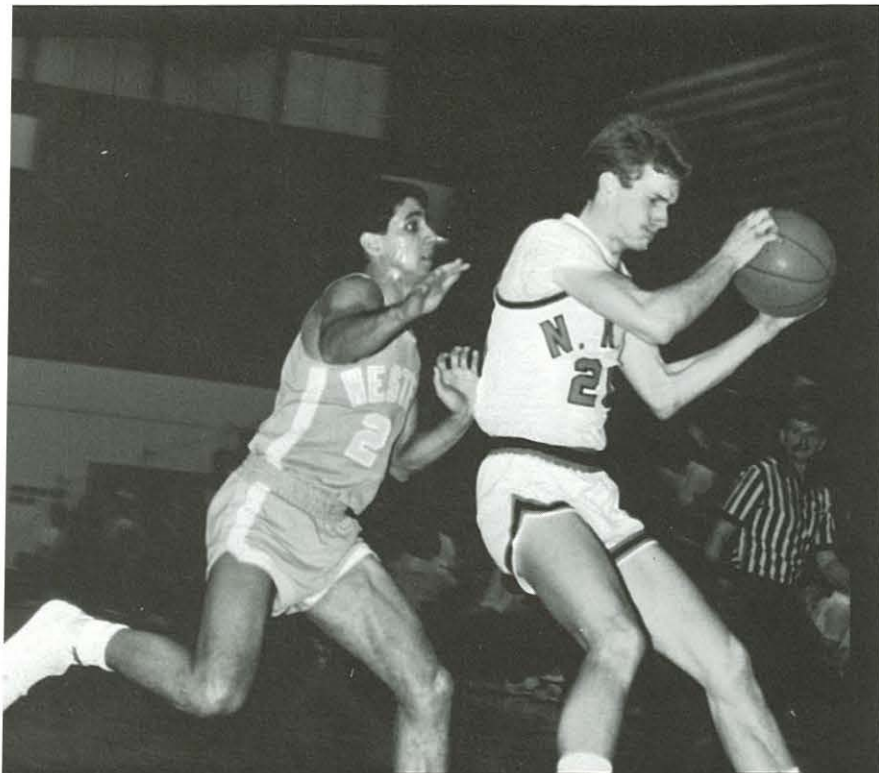


## MEN'S BASKETBALL

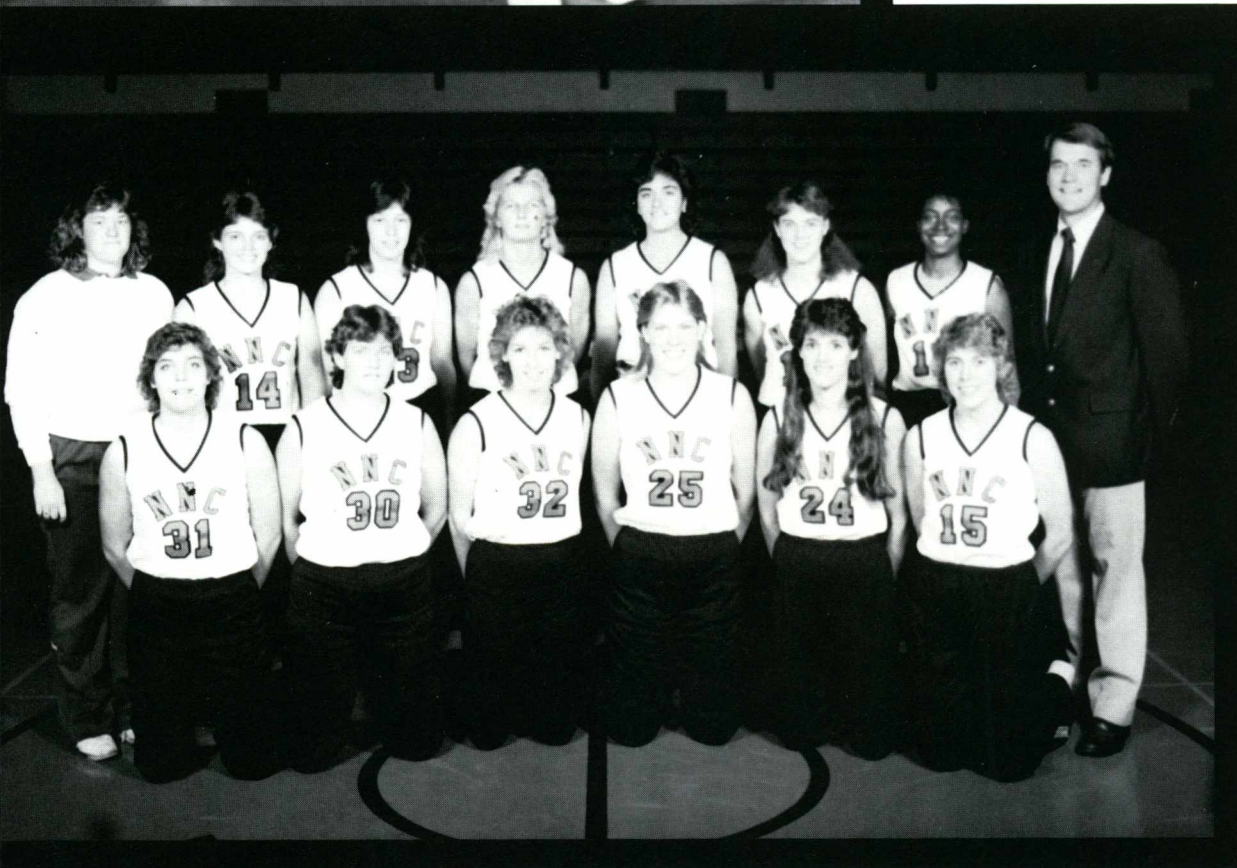


## WOMEN'S BASKETBALL

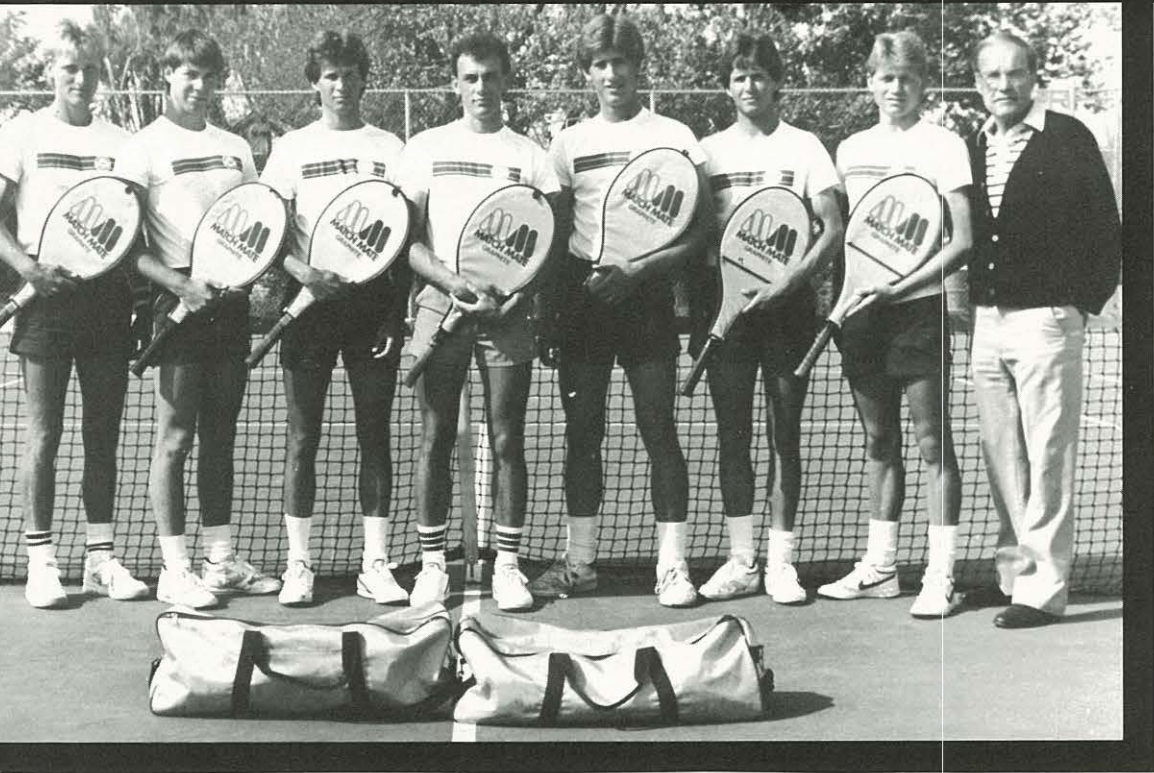
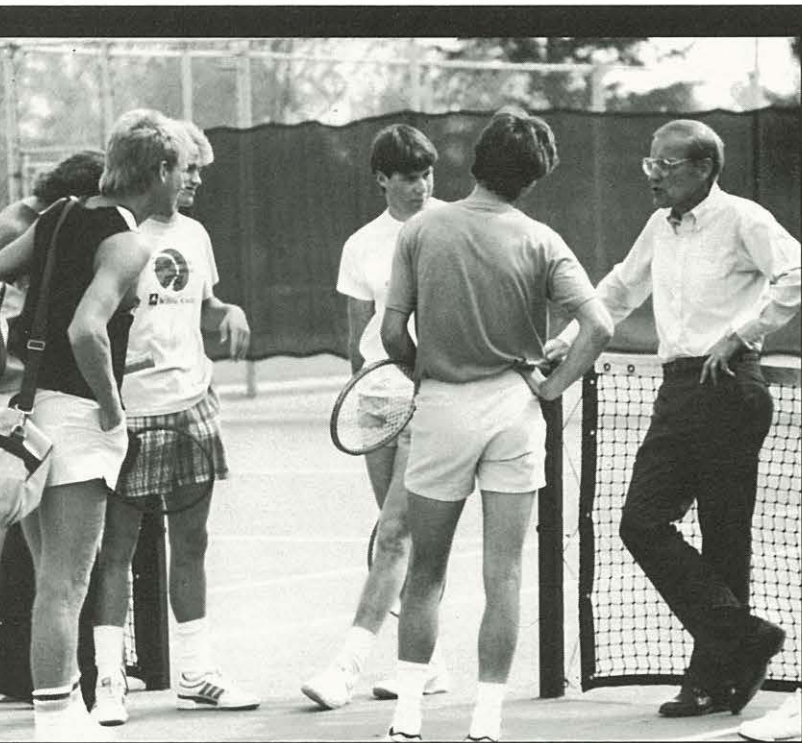


## MEN'S TENNIS

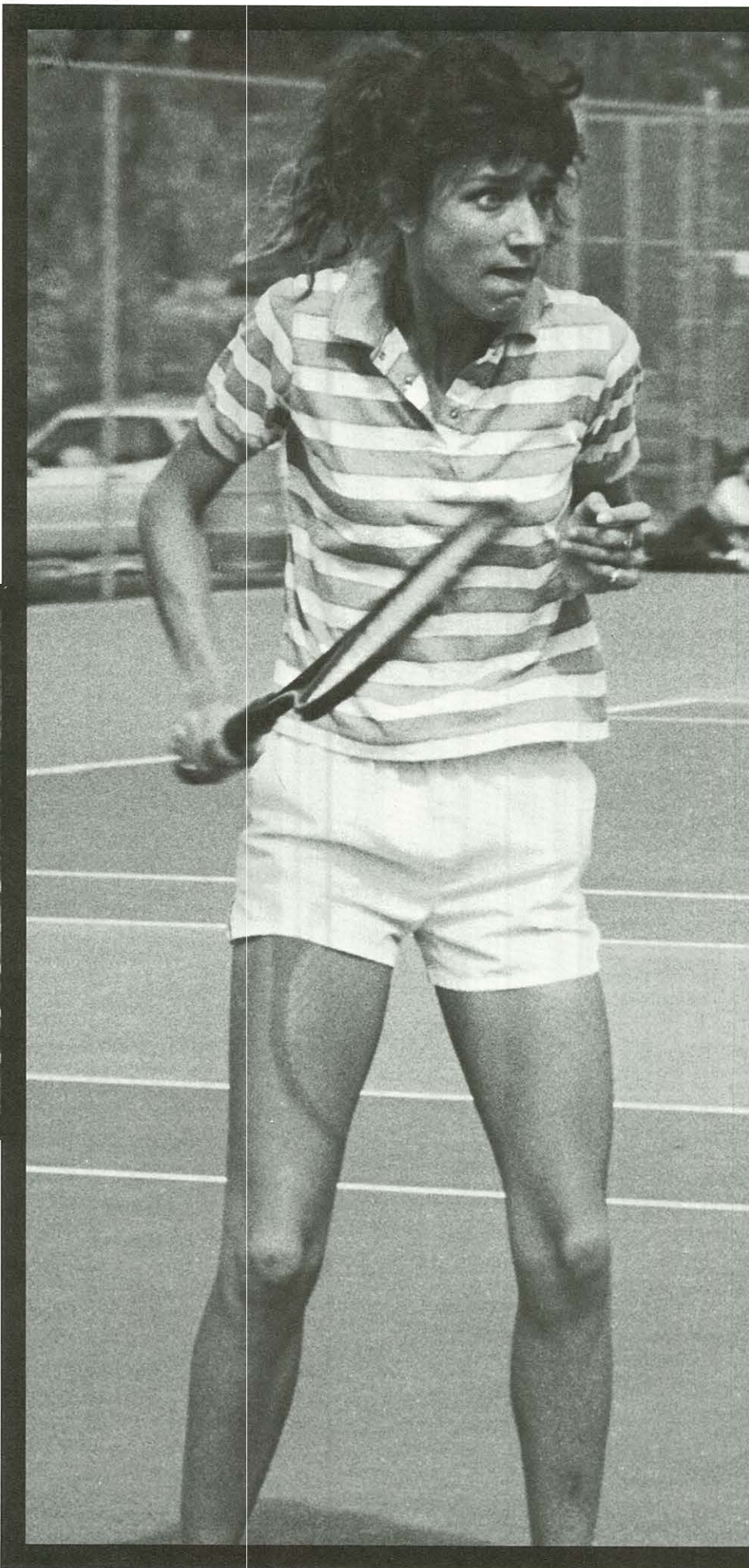

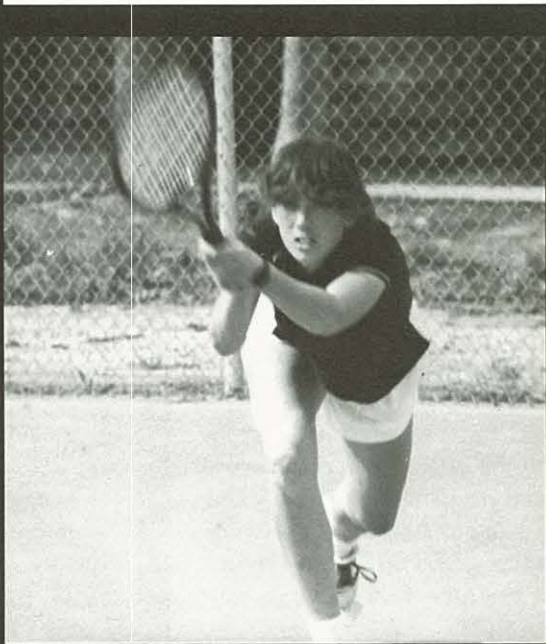

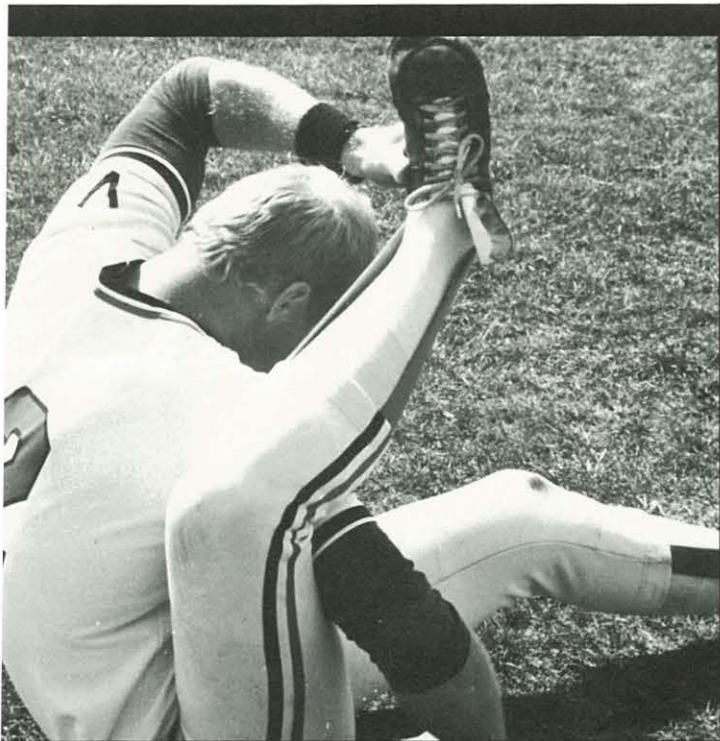


## BASEBALL

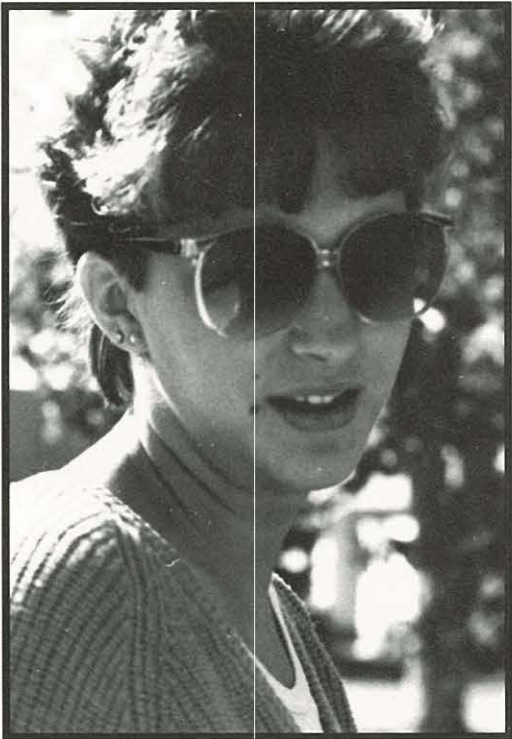
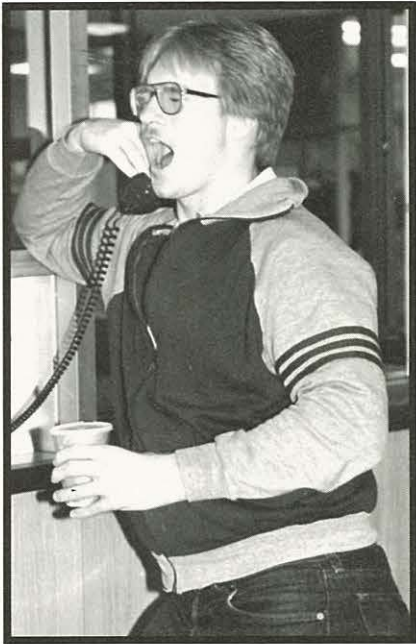












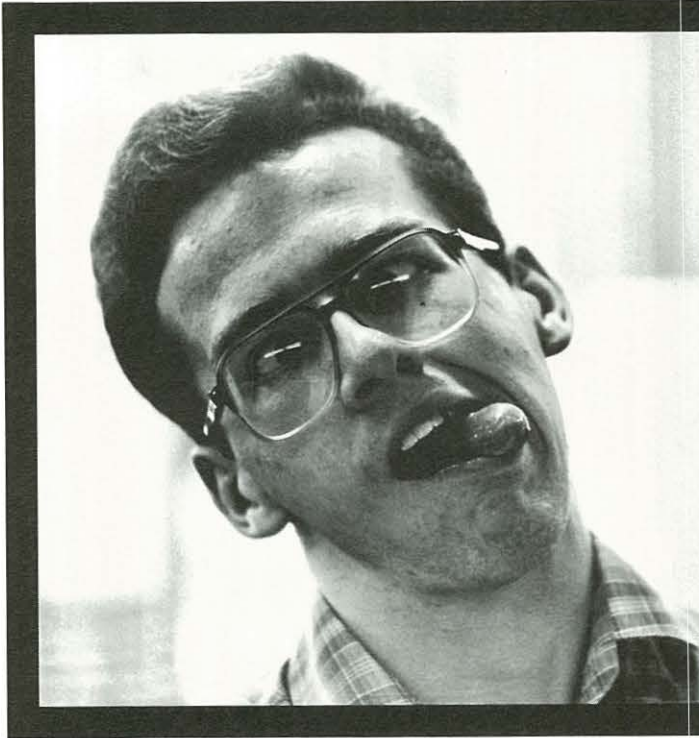


## CRUSADER

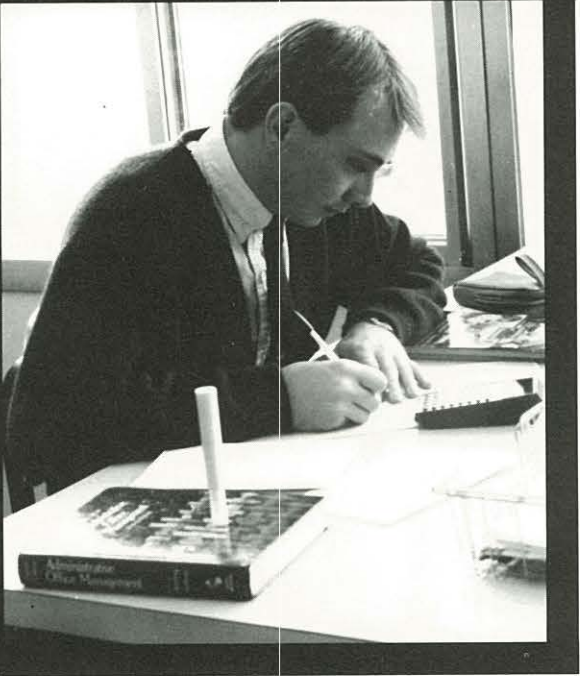
